HOW LONG HAS IT BEEN OPEN?

In the 1980's it was decided that a special place was needed where the older habitants of St Marychurch could meet.

In 1992 fund raising began in earnest and due to a magnificent effort, the huge sum £215,000 was raised which enabled the Centre to be built.

Financial support came from fund raising events; handsome donations from individuals, local groups, businesses, national organisations and children who collected 20p pieces in Smartie tubes.
